Ad Infinitum

Outline of Proposal (500 words maximum)

For this project I propose to explore the simplicity and complexity of persons living with alzheimer's disease. This disease is a progressive mental deterioration that may occur in persons of old age, due to the generalised degeneration of the brain. Due to the nature of alzheimer's disease, persons who are severely affected by it are often times taken down an infinite corridor of repetition, and their daily tasks mimic that of a young child. Having lived with my grandfather who has alzheimer's disease, I am aware of the challenges that are faced. Combining their fleeting memory and childlike temperament, alzheimer's patients' perception of the environment around them become fractured and thus changes with every passing day.

Building upon the themes of "fractured perception" and "daily routine", this project intends to create a threedimensional work that engages the viewer's perception of their environment in a manner that would inspire curiousity and frustration similar to that of someone with alzheimer's disease. A photo essay, narrating the "day in the life" of my grandfather who lives with the disease, will also be created to complement the threedimensioal work. The overall project is meant to showcase the seemingly simple lifestyle of an alzheimer's patient and at the same time engage the viewer's mental perception by contrasting that simplicity with a complex message.

A project similar to what I will undertaking was performed in a music video by an alternative rock band, OK Go – "Writings on the wall", that utilizes a variety of optical illusions and forced perspective sculptures that is used to convey their story. Viewing the success of their use of perspective works prove that this project can be done. Having a strong background in photography coupled with my graphical and design knowledge, I'm confident that this project can be accomplished beyond expectation and at next to no cost. A project budget, however, of \$1000 will be allocated toward the purchase of materials for the building of the three-dimensional work.

Due to the project's main participant having alzheimer's disease, he is being considered as vulnerable and his next of kin will give all necessary permissions. This shall be done by means of a release form, signed by his next of kin, so as to ensure an efficient and ethical workflow during the photography phase of the project.

Imaging

1. The subject to be photographed is an Alzheimer's patient. They will be photographed in a reportage style that documents a day in their life, from their perspective. This aspect of the project shall be delivered in the form of a printed photo essay book.

Installation

1. Title: Ad Infinitum, 2015.

The intended message is; to promote empathy and solidarity for those experiencing and living with alzheimer's disease patients.




Figure 2.0 - Concept Slide





Figure 5.2 - Concept Sketches

This project was titled and inspired in part by the Latin phrase, "Ad infinitum", which means, "without end".




Figure 3.0 - Ad Infinitum Meaning


